Job Summary	<p>A Safety Officer supports the Health, Safety, Environmental, Energy & Quality (HSEEQ) and training objectives onboard, ensuring all operations are carried out safely and in full compliance with company policies, regulatory requirements and industry standards.</p> <p>The role involves advising, training and mentoring crew members, promoting a strong safety culture, and ensuring that all safety management system (SMS) procedures are correctly understood and applied.</p> <p>The Safety Officer also plays a key role in monitoring safety performance, supporting risk assessments, and assisting with onboard inductions, emergency procedures and drill planning.</p> <p>They act as a central point of contact for competence systems offshore, liaise with onshore HSEEQ and HR teams, and contribute to safety meetings, reporting and continuous</p>

	<p>improvement initiatives to maintain high safety and training standards across the installation.</p>
<p>Role Details</p>	<p>This position is based on one of our semi-submersible drilling rigs, the Borgland Dolphin.</p> <p>The contract in Spain is for 7 firm wells with an option to extend by a further 3 wells. This is followed by a direct continuation of work in the UK (currently under a Letter of Intent) that would see the Borgland Dolphin contracted through to October 2031.</p> <p>The offshore rotations for the Borgland Dolphin will be 28 day on/28 day off rotation, whilst in Spain and 21 day on/21 day off rotation in the UK.</p>
